BACKGROUND

The Helen Bamber Foundation is a human rights organisation with an international reputation for providing medical consultation, therapeutic care, legal protection and practical support to survivors of trafficking and torture. We are a team of therapists, doctors, lawyers, caseworkers and administrators who help men, women and children recover from the emotional and physical damage they have suffered as a result of torture, human trafficking, or other forms of cruelty.

OVERVIEW OF THE ROLE

As a Clinical Psychologist within the Helen Bamber Foundation, you will be responsible for supporting the Heads of Therapies in providing a comprehensive range of therapeutic interventions to clients of the Helen Bamber Foundation.

This role will include delivery of highly specialised psychological assessments for both medico-legal and clinical purposes, provision of appropriate evidence-based therapies, delivery of clinical supervision to staff from non-clinical backgrounds who nonetheless have significant client contact, and supervision of assistant and trainee clinical psychologists on final year specialist placements. At times, the role may include input into policy, research and fundraising and delivery of consultancy and training.

We are looking for someone who is committed to working therapeutically with individuals who have experienced human rights abuses and who have developed trauma spectrum disorders as a result. In addition to proven experience in working therapeutically with this client group, the candidate will have a passion for human rights work beyond the individual client work, and a desire to contribute to effecting change at a policy level. This role requires the ability to react and respond creatively and appropriately to the needs of the charity.

Given the current COVID-19 pandemic, your role may need to be completed remotely, either in full, or in part, for the foreseeable future. However, you must be prepared to travel to our offices in Camden to carry out your duties if this becomes necessary in the future.

PERSON SPECIFICATION

The successful candidate will be a clinical psychologist who is passionate about working with victims of human rights abuses, delivering evidence-based therapies for Posttraumatic Stress Disorder and other mental health problems, as well as having an understanding of the unique social and political context our clients are living in and the effect of this on their psychological wellbeing.

Essential

- To have successfully completed a recognized doctoral level training in Clinical Psychology (DClinPsy) and to have completed a range of clinical placements during training.
- To be registered with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC).
- To have experience in working with clients with PTSD and other trauma spectrum disorders.
- To have experience in working with individuals who have experienced multiple traumatic events, developmental trauma and/or have a clinical presentation suggestive of 'complex' PTSD.
- Experience of delivering therapy for the treatment of PTSD using trauma focused CBT, EMDR, or Narrative Exposure Therapy.
- To have demonstrable experience in providing other evidence-based therapies for common mental health problems.
- To have experience in assessing individuals from a range of cultural or ethnic backgrounds.
- Experience of working with interpreters.
- Experience of, and commitment to, multidisciplinary team working.
- Experience of providing clinical supervision.
- Working knowledge of the legal, political and social issues in the human rights, asylum & refugee, and health sectors.

- Exceptional organizational skills with experience of managing multiple tasks and prioritizing effectively.
- Accuracy and excellent attention to detail.
- Good interpersonal and team working skills, with an ability to work independently and seize opportunities.
- Computer literate and confident in using all MS Office software.
- Understanding of, and commitment to, the objectives of Helen Bamber Foundation.

Desirable

- At least one year's post qualification experience.
- To have experience of working in the non-statutory sector.
- Prior experience of working with asylum seekers, refugees or survivors of trafficking in a clinical context.
